## **Book Description**

“13” is a comic book series about a society where everyone has a superpower, but for only one year.

## **Series Bio**

“13” is creator Dani Dixon’s unique take on the superpower subgenre. She didn’t want the characters to have secret identities, or to wear any capes and tights. She wanted to spread out the power, but not negate it – because if everyone had it, then it wasn’t special. Her solution? Everyone has a power, but only for one year. And that year – was age 13.

Since there would be no iconic uniforms to tell readers who the characters were, Dixon wanted to cement what each character looked like. So she held auditions. All of the main characters for “13” were cast. Then after a series of photo sessions, the artists had hundreds of photo references – not just of hair color and skin tone, but expressions and posture. The cast proved quite intriguing to readers and fans. Since the start of the series, they’ve appeared at numerous comic book store signings and conventions along with the artists and Dixon, the series writer.

Though “13” is about teens and they are certainly the target audience, many adults have become fans of the series as well. Kids love the idea of the freedom and power at such a young age. Adults on the hand, can appreciate the consequences of not taking advantage of a unique period in your life - and living with those choices.
